 - (c) Discussion and possible action with respect to correspondence from neighboring landowner regarding water management and condition of Bear Creek.

- 12. <u>Water Supply Agreements</u>. Consideration and possible action with respect to existing agreements for water supply with the Lower Colorado River Authority and water service through the West Travis County Public Utility Agency, water use under such agreements, water rates and fees charged to the District under such agreements, and other matters related to District water supply and conservation.
